(Jackson, Mississippi) Today, Attorney General Lynn Fitch announced the recent sentencing of Kiana Rochelle Cooper of Jackson, Mississippi, for one count of false pretenses. Cooper, a former employee of LoanMax Title Loans, knowingly filed fraudulent loans using the stolen personal identity information of others. This case was investigated and prosecuted by the Attorney General's Office.

I am thankful for the incredible team of investigators and prosecutors who ensured that justice was served in this case."

On November 20, 2025, Hinds County Circuit Court **Judge Debra H. Gibbs** sentenced Cooper to 10 years in custody of the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC) with two years to serve and an additional five years of post-release supervision upon release. Cooper was also ordered to pay \$44,948.00 in restitution to her victims.
