Empower Women, Promote Life Following the *Dobbs* **Decision**

What we do in the days, weeks and months after the Supreme Court releases the *Dobbs* decision is crucial. You have the power to shape the conversation and the reaction, so I have two requests.

First, we need to pay particular attention to the "Empower Women" part of our message. We know the life movement supports mothers. But abortion advocates do not want the American people to hear that. We must put our concern for the dignity of the woman front and center. Especially those women who are in the most challenging circumstances – abusive relationships, without family support, in poverty, without job skills or education.

Second, how we talk about life in these crucial weeks following the opinion matters, too. We need to react to the opinion, whichever way it comes down, with humility, hope, and respect. We told the Court that the American people were ready to take on the job of hashing out our differences on this issue. We need to show that we are ready to lead with civility.

I am grateful for all you have done to get us to this turning-point in history. When the Court gives abortion policymaking back to the people, I ask you to join me in building this new culture of life that will empower women and promote life.
