As Attorney General, I am dedicated to serving the needs of crime victims and their families. We have restructured our Bureau of Victim Assistance to provide a more personalized approach to victim advocacy. Each of our advocates is assigned to a geographic region of the State, where they work with law enforcement, courts, shelters, and other service providers to assist victims with resources and support. We also administer the Crime Victims' Compensation Program, which provides financial assistance to victims of crime. Compensation may be available for a wide variety of services including counseling, crime scene cleanup, domestic violence relocation and temporary housing, medical and dental expenses, lost wages and more. My team is dedicated to assisting applicants navigate the application process, and process applications as expeditiously as possible.

If you move away from your home due to domestic violence, sexual abuse or stalking, we also offer the Address Confidentiality Program, which allows qualified participants to obtain a substitute address for receiving mail, obtaining a Mississippi driver's license, or enrolling children in school.
