

Parents, **Be Informed!**

- 7 out of 10 pills laced with Fentanyl contains a lethal dose. It only takes 1 time taking 1 unknown pill to kill.
- Fentanyl concentration can vary even within the same batch of pills. Just because one is safe, doesn't mean they all are.
- ▶ Teach your kids to be cautious of pills not provided by a doctor or pharmacist, especially if purchased through social media.
- ▶ Talk to your kids about how to administer naloxone—it could save a life.
