# A Note from AG Lynn Fitch

When a child is abused – physically, mentally, or sexually, the strength and support of their journey through the criminal justice system and their pathway to healing should not depend on where they live. But in Mississippi, it largely has because there has been no uniform best practice guide to help the professionals who work with child abuse victims.

Now that is changing. Last month, <u>I announced Mississippi's first Statewide</u> <u>Protocol for Child Abuse Response</u>, a collaborative effort with the Children's Advocacy Centers of Mississippi, as well as prosecutors, courts, and law enforcement.

This new protocol will help ensure uniformity and quality in that the way we investigate and prosecute child abuse cases, as well as how we care for the mental, emotional, and physical needs of the young victim. This is more than just a document. It is a symbol of our commitment — to protect, to heal, to bring justice. It is a promise that no child will be overlooked.

As the Hotline award comes up for review, we need the Department of Health and Human Services to be our partner in restoring this function of the Hotline so we do not lose one more person due to this gap in reporting."

"We are committed to continuing our investigative operations to undermine human trafficking rings, and we are intent on seeing these cases through in the courtroom," **Mississippi Attorney General Lynn Fitch** said after Coleman's sentencing. "When we put these predators away, we help these victims take back their power from their traffickers, and that is an important foundation as they rebuild their lives."

**General Fitch** made the following statement: "For years, Mississippi's independent pharmacies have been forced to take artificially low reimbursements because the PBMs have used their influence and leverage to effectively force non-negotiable contracts on them. These small business owners are already operating on razor-thin profit margins and this unfair PBM practice, especially when coupled by fees levied by GoodRx, often means they spend more to fill a prescription than they make on it. Ultimately, they're having to shutter their businesses, leaving Mississippians, especially those in rural areas, with few options as they seek medical care.

This is wrong. And it is against Mississippi law. Mississippi is fighting back and we achieved an important victory.
