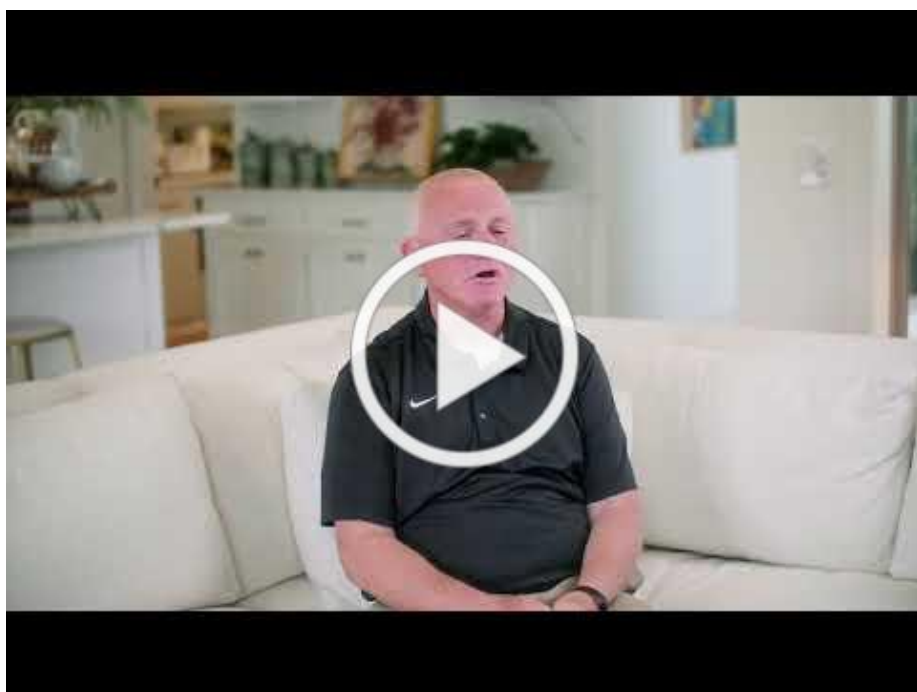

*How to Take Action*

As part of the One Pill Can Kill initiative, the Attorney General's office is distributing Fentanyl Harm Prevention Kits across the State - which include two fentanyl test strips, a safe drug disposal bag, and a pill identification card that identifies whether the drug is legitimate or counterfeit - to colleges and universities, law enforcement agencies, community mental health centers, and other community groups. Additionally, [in 2024, Attorney General Fitch introduced her Emergency Overdose Boxes](#), which can be mounted in public places and include naloxone and other tools needed to prevent a deadly overdose. The Emergency Overdose Boxes were developed in coordination with Harbor Path, a nonprofit dedicated to putting naloxone within arm's reach of anyone who needs it.
