Victim Advocates by Region



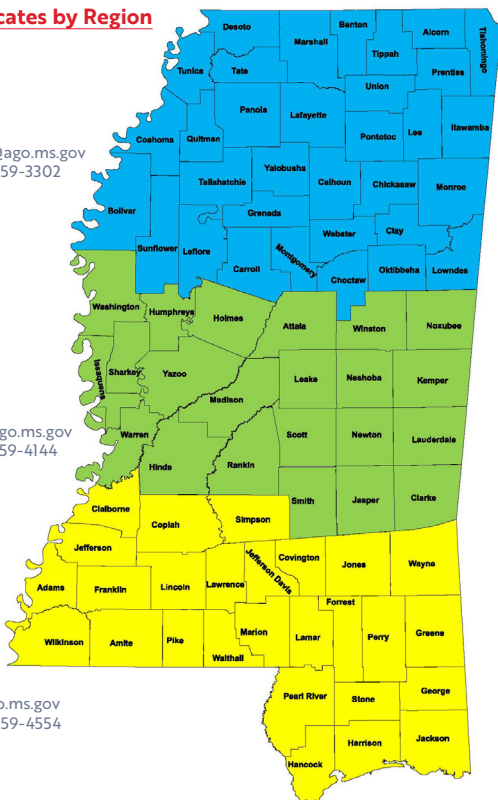
