A Message from Mississippi Attorney General Lynn Fitch

I was proud to join President Trump's A Home for Every Child campaign, launched by the U.S Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for Children and Families, by signing the first [Attorney General proclamation](#) supporting the initiative this month. The pathway to a stable, loving, forever home is a legal process, and as Attorney General, I am proud of the part our team of dedicated attorneys and paralegals plays in achieving the goals of A Home for Every Child. There are nearly 4,000 children in the foster care system in Mississippi, and in 2025, our office legally cleared 647 foster children for adoption.

Streamlining and improving foster care and adoption systems is a key pillar of our The Empowerment Project agenda to empower women and promote strong Mississippi families. I am grateful for President Trump's leadership to ensure that children in foster care and the foster families who care for them are supported. With stronger coordination and a focus on outcomes for children, we can make real, lasting improvements to Mississippi's foster care system and give every child the stability and support they deserve.

This month, two pieces of legislation that I brought to the Legislature were signed into law. Together, they demonstrate our commitment to caring for and protecting our most vulnerable, and I am grateful to the Legislature for being such a strong partner on these priorities from my legislative agenda.

[HB 1131](#) increases the penalties on the buyers in the illicit human trafficking market. Without demand, human trafficking cannot exist, so this is an important step in disrupting this criminal industry. [SB 2369](#) ensures that if a parent wins at a casino and owes child support, that support will be paid first. This legislation is a crucial step in strengthening child support enforcement and making sure children come first.

WXXV - State fentanyl strike force makes major bust

Attorney General Lynn Fitch says a statewide law enforcement operation targeting drugs and illegal activity has led to dozens of arrests. ‘Operation Check Mate’ was led by the state’s fentanyl strike force. It resulted in 20 felony arrests, ten misdemeanor arrests, and one DUI, mainly centered around the Meridian area.

Darkhorse Press - Biloxi man sentenced to 10 years in federal prison for child sexual abuse material charge

Mississippi Attorney General Lynn Fitch announced the sentencing of a Biloxi man on a child sexual abuse material charge following a joint investigation by state and federal authorities.

“Predators who seek to exploit children in Mississippi will not go unpunished, and my office is committed to holding these individuals accountable,” **Fitch said** in a statement. “I am grateful to our partners at the FBI and the U.S. Attorney’s Office for their work to secure this sentence. Together, we are making Mississippi a safer place for everyone.”
