- The supplies will be shipped directly to the centers and used to help the women and children they support.

According to a 2025 report, in 2024, pregnancy centers across the US provided goods and services worth [over \\$452 million](#), including:

- over 630,000 ultrasounds;
- over 700,000 pregnancy tests;
- over 230,000 STI/STD tests;
- over 1,000,000 consultations with new clients;
- over 6,300,000 packs of diapers;
- over 39,000 new car seats;
- over 36,000 strollers; and
- over 4,980,000 baby outfits.

In addition, in Mississippi, businesses have been eligible for several years for tax credits for financial contributions to pregnancy centers under the Pregnancy Resource

Charitable Organizations ([PRCO](#)). The Legislature this year expanded eligibility for the tax credit to individuals.

Supporting pregnant women and mothers is one of five pillars that make up Attorney General Fitch's Empowerment Project, a policy agenda launched in 2023 following her victory at the Supreme Court in the *Dobbs* case:

1. Making Quality Childcare More Affordable and Accessible
2. Promoting Workplace Flexibility Policies
3. Streamlining and Improving Foster Care and Adoption Systems
4. Enhancing Child Support Enforcement
5. Supporting pregnant women and mothers

Among the more than one dozen Empowerment Project initiatives passed by the Legislature is Mississippi Access to Maternal Assistance, or [MAMA](#) (SB 2781). This free website and mobile app provides easy access to hundreds of public, private, and faith-based resources and services to help women and families in need. This year, the Legislature passed another Empowerment Project initiative, providing that past-due child support should be paid out of casino winnings.
