AG Fitch in the News

WLOX - Mississippi AG Fitch touts human trafficking arrests, fraud crackdowns, and Roblox settlement

Mississippi Attorney General Lynn Fitch said her office has made 205 arrests and recovered 394 human trafficking victims in the state over the last few years, citing the numbers as evidence of Mississippi's standing as a leader in combating the crime.

"Not one person said, I want to be a victim in this human trafficking circle," **Fitch said.**

Fitch said her office has trained more than 600 law enforcement officers across the state to support multi-jurisdictional operations. She said recovery teams include shelter staff, counselors, a sexual assault nurse, and survivors who speak directly with victims.

"We've got survivors who now will talk to these victims and say, look, all these people are here to help you. They want to help you move on with your journey," **Fitch said.**

WAPT - Mississippi wins drug price settlement share

Attorney General Lynn Fitch announced that Mississippi is part of a coalition of 48 states and territories that reached a \$29.6 million settlement with Glenmark Pharmaceuticals to resolve allegations of price manipulation and anti-competitive practices involving generic prescription drugs.

"Generic drugs are supposed to be a more affordable alternative, and they are often a lifeline for Americans who rely on them," **Fitch said** in a statement. "We are holding the companies that kept prices artificially high accountable for taking advantage of families, and I encourage any Mississippian who thinks they may be eligible to register today."

Two people were arrested during an online child exploitation operation in Lamar County, **Attorney General Lynn Fitch** and Lamar County Sheriff Danny Rigel

announced.

Officials said Operation Predator's End was conducted to protect children from online exploitation and grooming.

"I will continue to aggressively pursue justice for children who are exploited and abused by predators online," **Fitch said**. "And I am dedicated to building a network of law enforcement officers with the tools and training to make the Internet a safer place. Thank you, Sheriff Rigel, for taking this strong stand for children."



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
