WXXV - Memorial Hospital Gulfport launches outpatient maternal-fetal medicine services for high risk pregnancies

Memorial Hospital in Gulfport is expanding access to high-risk pregnancy care. A new outpatient partnership brings maternal-fetal medicine specialists to the Coast.

Those are Cecilia Gambala and Gabriella Pridjian. The physicians will offer weekly outpatient clinics on the first floor. A referral from an OB-GYN is required. The clinic is located on the first floor of the hospital next to the outpatient pharmacy.

Darkhorse Press - Former Corinth pharmacist sentenced in \$786K healthcare fraud scheme

A former Corinth pharmacist has been sentenced for conspiracy to commit healthcare fraud, **Mississippi Attorney General Lynn Fitch** announced Monday.

According to **Fitch's office**, Quinn and Null were former pharmacists and owners of Medical Plaza Pharmacy in Corinth. Between 2017 and 2021, prosecutors said they knowingly submitted false and fraudulent claims to Medicare and Medicaid for pharmaceutical drugs that were not dispensed to patients. Null was previously sentenced April 20, 2026.

"We are sending a clear message that here in Mississippi, we are committed to fighting waste, fraud, and corruption," **Fitch said**. "We are grateful for such strong partners at the Office of the Inspector General and U.S. Attorney's Office. Working together, we are ensuring justice is served on behalf of Mississippi taxpayers."

The case was investigated by the **Mississippi Attorney General's Office** and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General. It was prosecuted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Northern District of Mississippi.

WJTV - 1 arrested, 4 victims recovered in Starkville human trafficking operation

Attorney General Lynn Fitch (R-Miss.) announced the completion of Operation Stark Reality, which was conducted in Starkville and led by her Human Trafficking Task Force. **Fitch said** the operation resulted in one arrest and the recovery of three victims and one child.

"We are committed to building a network of law enforcement across Mississippi trained in the best techniques for disrupting human trafficking operations and helping victims start the road to recovery," **the attorney general said**. "Mississippi is leading the nation in our approach to taking down predators and giving victims a chance to start over without shame or blame."

Magnolia Tribune - Attorney General announces indictments against 11 Mississippians for \$12.3 million in Medicaid fraud

Eleven Mississippians have been indicted on alleged Medicaid fraud totaling \$12.3 million, according to a statement from the **office of Attorney General Lynn Fitch** (R) released on Tuesday.

"These indictments are just the latest efforts we are taking to fight waste, fraud and corruption," **Fitch said**. "I will remain laser focused on rooting out fraud, recovering money wrongfully stolen from hard working taxpayers, and holding fraudsters accountable."

"I am proud to partner with President Trump to protect taxpayer dollars and ensure that money meant to help those in need is not stolen from safety net programs," **Fitch added**.

A five-point plan to reduce Medicaid waste and strengthen enforcement was presented by **Fitch** to the White House Task Force to Eliminate Fraud, led by Vice President J.D. Vance (R), back in May.

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
