Spectrum News - Exclusive: HHS adds all 50 states to initiative to improve the ratio of homes to foster kids

The Department of Health and Human Services is adding all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico to an initiative to reduce paperwork handled by state foster care systems so workers have more time to focus on helping foster children, Spectrum News has learned.

“State agencies are, in the most literal sense, submitting reports to us that are 250 to 300 pages, and that’s just draining their time and energy from doing things on the front lines that would actually benefit children and families,” Alex Adams, an assistant secretary of the Administration for Children and Families, said in an exclusive interview with Spectrum News.

The Yazoo Herald - AG Fitch Announces 40-Year Sentence in Child Exploitation Case

Robert Stephan Wilson, Jr., 50, of Long Beach, Mississippi, was sentenced to 40 years today for one count of child exploitation. This case originated with an undercover

operation led by **Attorney General Lynn Fitch's office** and was investigated and prosecuted by her office, with assistance from the Long Beach Police Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

"During our operation, we found thousands of images of child sexual abuse material stored on Wilson's electronic devices," **said Attorney General Lynn Fitch**. "We are committed to protecting our children from abuse and exploitation by predators online. I am grateful to our partners at the FBI and the Long Beach Police Department for their work to secure justice in this case and make the Internet a little safer."

WLOX - Mississippi AG Fitch touts human trafficking arrests, fraud crackdowns, and Roblox settlement

Mississippi Attorney General Lynn Fitch said her office has made 205 arrests and recovered 394 human trafficking victims in the state over the last few years, citing the numbers as evidence of Mississippi's standing as a leader in combating the crime.

"Not one person said, I want to be a victim in this human trafficking circle," **Fitch** said.

WJTV - Mississippi attorney general calls for tougher rules to stop robocalls

Attorney General Lynn Fitch joined a bipartisan coalition with 49 other attorneys general pushing the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to strengthen its "Know Your Customer" (KYC) rules to help prevent scammers from using the U.S. communications network to make illegal robocalls.

Last year, officials said Americans received more than 29.6 billion scam robocalls and texts and lost nearly \$2 billion to these scams.

"My office is aggressively fighting illegal robocalls and texts, but we need stronger federal rules to stem the flow of calls at the source. Federal Know Your Customer requirements have been useful, but until now, they have lacked effective enforcement mechanisms," said **Fitch**. "This new rule will give us better information and leverage to go after and stop the calls and texts that are more than a nuisance – they are a gateway for scammers."

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
